#### Opportunity to Visit the Galapagos Islands

The National Shell Museum and Aquarium (NSMA) is organizing a trip to the Galapagos Islands in September 2024, and Science Director and Curator of the NSMA,

Dr. Leal will lead mollusk observations and present talks (among other activities during the trip) in that unique journey of exploration.

The Galapagos Islands are famous for their role in the development of Charles Darwin's theory of natural selection, which ultimately became one of the solid foundations of our current understanding of evolution. Due to their origin and type of geological development, oceanic islands are natural biological laboratories that allow researchers to study the evolution of terrestrial and marine organisms under conditions of increasing isolation.

Through field observations and aboard-ship lectures, we will discuss the molluscan fauna of the Galapagos, their origin, and biodiversity.
